ROLL CALL OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

CONTEST GOAL: To promote spirit and camaraderie among State Conference participants as they vocalize a common theme.

ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARD: A NMASC member school must have paid state conference registration and must be in attendance at the state conference to receive any state accolade.

PROCEDURE:

- Roll call will be presented, videoed, during the 2nd General Session on Friday morning.
- Roll call is to be a song or chant no longer than thirty seconds that supports or promotes the conference theme and your school in a positive manner.
- We are using **Flipgrid Format**. Flipgrid is programmed to cut off at 30 seconds.
- Roll Call is to be submitted as a video at nmsac.org not to exceed 30 seconds, by February 1st, 2021.
- The video presentation may be spliced together to accommodate the current Governor's executive order as allowed.
- Musical accompaniment of any kind is not permitted & will result in disqualification.
- Members of the Executive Board will determine whether or not the presentations meet the contest guidelines. Presentations that do not follow the guidelines will be disqualified.
- Roll call presentation order will be alphabetical by school. Roll Calls will be presented by school level: middle-level and high school.

JUDGING CRITERIA: (see State Conference Roll Contest Rubric at nmsac.org)

A committee of council advisors will judge the Roll Calls on the following:

- Performance Guidelines (10 points)
- Support of conference theme (30 points)
- Spirit/Presentation (30 points)
- Originality (20 points)
- Costume/Prop Support (10 points)

NOTE: Per the request of Advisors for contest feedback, a rubric has been created. School Advisors are to print this rubric, use it as a check-off highlighted in yellow only.

AWARD:

- Judging Committee:

A committee of advisors will judge the roll calls.

The judging committee will select the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finalists for high school and middle level.

The 2nd and 3rd place finalists for each level will be recognized in the Award & Recognition session of the State Conference. The 1st place winner from each level will be USPS mailed an award.

- Delegates Choice:

School delegations will select, by ballot, by school, the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finalists from high school and middle level.

The 2nd and 3rd place finalists for each level will be recognized in the Award & Recognition session of the State Conference. 1st place from each level will be USPS mailed an award.
