

ROLL CALL OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

CONTEST GOAL: To promote spirit and camaraderie among State Conference participants as they vocalize a common theme.

ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARD: A NMASC member school must have paid state conference registration and must be in attendance at the state conference to receive any state accolade.

PROCEDURE:

- Roll call will be presented during the 2nd General Session on Friday morning.
- Roll call is to be a song or chant no longer than thirty seconds that supports or promotes the conference theme in a positive manner.
- A school will be disqualified if the roll call exceeds 30 seconds or if inappropriate language or gestures are used. Participants must present from the seats where the school delegation is seated and remain there throughout the roll call.
- A school will be disqualified if a cell phone or paper with the roll call words is used during the presentation.
- Musical accompaniment of any kind is not permitted & will result in disqualification.
- Members of the Executive Board will determine whether or not the presentations meet the contest guidelines. Presentations that do not follow the guidelines will be disqualified.
- Roll call presentation order will be random selection. Roll Calls will be presented by school level: middle-level and high school. School names will be randomly drawn by the NMASC Secretary from the podium at the time of competition.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

A committee of council advisors will judge the Roll Calls on the following:

- Performance Guidelines (10 points)
- Support of conference theme (30 points)
- Spirit/Presentation (30 points)
- Originality (20 points)
- Costume/Prop Support (10 points)

NOTE: A contest rubric has been created for each school to conduct a self-analysis prior to performing the roll call at the state conference.

AWARD:

- Judging Committee:

A committee of advisors will judge the roll calls.

The judging committee will select the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finalists for high school and middle level.

The 2nd and 3rd place finalists for each level will be recognized in the Award & Recognition session of the State Conference.

1st place from each level will be presented an award.

- Delegates Choice:

School delegations will select, by ballot, by school, the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finalists from high school and middle level.

The 2nd and 3rd place finalists for each level will be recognized in the Award & Recognition session of the State Conference.

1st place from each level will be presented an award.
